Is it hard for you to get to the phone? Or are you receiving calls you don't want to answer, like salesmen, scammers, and people who want your attention when you're busy?

We understand, and recommend that you don't answer any call from a number you don't recognize.

An answering machine or voicemail is very helpful. If you have one and you don't answer, we will leave a message, identifying ourselves as being from LEND A HAND.

Please call us back if we ask you to do so. We may be calling about transportation, or something special, like counting the number of tables and chairs needed for the next social lunch, or how many bags of fruit and vegetables we need to prepare for delivery.
